- Serve as the Global Performing Arts Teacher in our Global Arts department

- Implement a sequential, developmentally appropriate performing arts curriculum from PreK-6 that nurtures creativity, collaboration, and performance skills
- Integrate creative movement, drama, and storytelling, and Responsive classroom strategies to support whole-child development and artistic exploration.
- Incorporate global performance traditions, storytelling, and world dance forms to deepen understanding of diverse artistic expressions
- Create a safe, engaging, inclusive, and joyful classroom environment where all children are heard, supported, valued, and celebrated for their unique identities and creative contributions.
- Participate actively in curriculum planning, departmental meetings, and cross-disciplinary projects.
- Co-create and co-direct grade level performances and interdisciplinary showcases that highlight the creative process and community connections.
- Lead and produce the annual school wide performance of the Winter Festival of Holidays.
- Partner with families and local artists and organizations to bring authentic community-based arts experiences to our students and community.
- Maintain records on each child's progress and provide parents with oral and written reports of the child's accomplishments.
- Support the team in researching and developing local artistic and multicultural partnerships to connect with the diverse communities of Los Angeles.
